JOTTINGS.

BY F. E. P. LYNDE.

One fact about United States envelopes that I don't believe is very generally known, is that in the postmaster's report for 1866, or thereabout, the announcement is made that any one bringing envelopes in sufficient quantity, it did not make any difference of what kind, quality, size, shape or color, they would be stamped with the United States envelope stamp, and of course would be good for postage. Would it not be pleasant if somebody had taken him at his word, which is very likely, to find some peculiar shades and colors of paper staring us in the face?

Much the same regulation existed in the English post-office about envelopes, which I believe is now done away with, the very pleasant result of continually finding them on all kinds of paper, and what is worse, the compound envelopes come that way. Another fact in regard to the last-named stamps which may not be well known, is that compound envelopes can not be bought at any post-office in the United Kingdom, but must be ordered in quantities of \pounds_5 or more.

There has been called to my notice the fact that the 3c. 1864 envelope of the United States has been seen with a Wells-Fargo Pony Express, 25c., along side of it, having passed through the mails.

I catalogue here a new Confederate local, which I believe was (or is) in the possession of Mr. Richert, for Jonesboro, Tenn. The design is like the plains of Virginia; wording, J. E. Williams. Paid. Jonesboro, Tenn. It has been authenticated by J. E. Williams, who says that it was used there.

One of the most amusing things one meets in Philately, is the remarkable nerve, if I may use the term, of some of the small dealers. To quote a specimen : As all must know by this time there is to be a new die for the United States envelope stamps, and just on the strength of this, that when I asked a correspondent to see if he could get me any envelopes of the present set that were not on sale at the post-office here, he sent me a list of some at the most outrageous prices, saying that as they would not be long in use they would become very rare. His prices could not be realized in three years.

Whatever ridicule some of our brethren poke at Democratic simplicity, they can't say that the Post-office Department has been slow in giving Philately plenty of novelties, and the supply has not ceased.



Curacoa.—A stamped 5 cent card is now in use. The color is red on pink.

- Dutch Indies.—Adhesive and envelope stamps of the value of 12¹/₂ cents, gray, are said to have been issued.
- Falkland Islands.—The 1½d. post card has appeared in double form.
- *Gibraltar.*—The surcharged stamps have been superseded by a new set, of which
- these values have thus far come over, viz: 1 penny, rose; 2 pence, brown; 2¹/₂ pence, blue.
- Great Britain.—A new series of stamps came into use the first of January, of which we have seen only the following: ½ penny, red; 1½ pence, lilac and green; 2 pence, red and green; 2½ pence, purple on blue; 3 pence, yellow; 4 pence, green and brown; 5 pence, purple and blue; 6 pence, black on pink; 9 pence, purple and blue; 1 shilling, green.
- Jamaica.—The color of the 3d. has been changed to olive.
- Monaco.—The Ioc. card is now printed in brown on lilac.
- Madagascar.—Another variety of the Madagascar stamps has come over. They are similar to the preceding ones but the seal of the British Consul is inscribed, "British Consular Mail, Autanauarivo." There are said to be the following values: I, I¹/₂, 2, 3, 4¹/₂, 8, 9 pence.
- Uruguay.—The color of the 5 centesimi has been changed to lilac.




