## INTRODUCTION

In November 2020, Don Denman prepared a digital edition of the nine years of publication of the Quaker City Philatelist, a philatelic journal that was published between January 1886 and July 1893.

The 103 individual monthly issues contained between 6 and 40 pages, and except for the second and third issues of 1886, the pages in these issues were numbered sequentially throughout the year. Thus, the 1886 Volume had pages numbers between 1 and 8 for the first three issues, the numbered sequentially between 25 and 100 through the end of the year, and the 1887 Volume had pages numbered between 1 and 192, and so forth.

In addition, an Index to the philatelic articles which were included in the publication was prepared by William Ricketts and published by Hiram E. Deats in 1917. Unfortunately, all the entries in this Index referred to the location of an article by a combination of the Volume in which the article appeared, the year that article was published, and the page on which the article began. It appears that the compiler of the Index used a bound volume of the Quaker City Philatelist to make this compilation.

For example, the initial entry in the Index reads
ABYSSINIA. Chronicle. IX (94) 18. Which means Volume IX, published in 1894, and begins on page 18.

This does not provide sufficient information to allow the reader to know which of the 12 individual issues he should download to find this article, as he does not know how many pages were in the different issues of the journal which were published in 1894.

The Page Number to Issue Number cross-reference on the next page resolves this difficulty. By looking at the column headed 1894, and going down to the entry which shows the page range 1328 , it becomes apparent that the article of interest was published in the February 1894 issue of the journal.

For a more complicate example, consider the entry on the first page of the index which reads

## ARGENTINE REPUBLIC. Chronicle. IV(89)155, VI(91)107-142-157, VII(92)3-167-179, VIII(93)62-89-

 102.For the first entry: IV(89)155, we will go to the column for 1889, and look down to find that page 155 was part of the December 1889 issue.

For the next entry: $\mathrm{VI}(91) \mathbf{1 0 7 - 1 4 2 - 1 5 7 , ~ w e ~ k n o w ~ t h a t ~ t h e r e ~ w e r e ~ a r t i c l e s ~ w i t h ~ t h i s ~ t i t l e ~ i n ~}$ three issues. Looking down the column for 1891, we find that page 107 was in the July 1891 issue, page 142 was in the September issue, and page 157 was in the October 1891 issue.

A similar procedure will yield the issue for the other entries in this Index entry.
We hope this cross-reference will allow readers of the Quaker City Philatelist to more quickly locate an article of interest when they are using this Stamp Smarter resource.
