LIST OF STAMPED PAPER ON SALE AT THE PHILATELIC AGENCY FOR FACE VALUE PLUS RETURN POSTAGE AND REGISTRY FEE.

No mailing list is maintained for the distribution of this circular. It is revised at necessary intervals, and must be written for if desired.

Remittance must accompany each order and should be made by postal money order, payable to the Philatelic Agency. Postage stamps are not accepted in payment. Cash should be sent by registered mail; persons sending cash by ordinary mail do so at their own risk. Stamps are not sent on approval. The Agency does not prepare first day covers.

In addition to postage at the rate of 3¢ per ounce the registry fee on shipments valued at \$5.00 or less is 15¢; \$5.01 to \$25.00, 18¢; \$25.01 to \$50.00, 20¢; \$50.01 to \$75.00, 25¢; \$75.01 to \$100.00, 30¢; \$100.01 to \$200.00, 40¢; \$200.01 to \$300.00, 50¢; \$300.01 to \$400.00, 60¢; \$400.01 to \$500.00, 70¢. The rate on orders valued in excess of \$500.00 may be obtained by patrons from their local postmasters.

It is requested that patrons type their orders on paper the same size as this sheet if convenient; also that remarks or inquiries not relating directly to the order be submitted in a separate letter. Patrons of the Agency should not send a self-addressed envelope for the return of their purchase. Such envelopes are frequently found unsuited for the purpose. Small balances due the purchaser will be returned in 1 and 2-cent postage stamps.
