Please address all orders and communications relating thereto to the "Philatelic Agency, Post Office Department, Washington, D. C." This form may be used as an order blank. No mailing list is maintained for its distribution. At necessary intervals, it is revised, and must be written for if desired.

Remittance must accompany each order and should be made by postal money order or certified check, payable to the "Philatelic Agency." Postage stamps are not accepted in payment. Cash should be sent by registered mail; persons sending cash by ordinary mail do so at their own risk. Stamps are not sent C.O.D. The Agency does not prepare first day covers.

In addition to postage at the rate of 3¢ per ounce or fraction thereof, the registry fee on shipments valued at \$5.00 or less is 15¢; \$5.01 to \$25.00, 18¢; \$25.01 to \$50.00, 20¢; \$50.01 to \$75.00, 25¢; \$75.01 to \$100.00, 30¢; \$100.01 to \$200.00, 40¢; \$200.01 to \$300.00, 50¢; \$300.01 to \$400.00, 60¢; \$400.01 to \$500.00, 70¢. The rate on orders valued in excess of \$500.00 may be obtained by patrons from their local postmasters.

It is requested that remarks or inquiries not relating directly to the order be submitted in a separate letter. Patrons of the Agency should not send a self-addressed envelope for the return of their purchase. Such envelopes are frequently found unsuited for the purpose. Small balances due the purchaser will be returned in 1 and 2-cent postage stamps.

PLATE NUMBERS

Until further notice, to insure the receipt of plate numbers, patrons are required to purchase 50 stamps from the ½¢ to 3¢ values, inclusive; strips of 30 from the 4¢ to 10¢ inclusive; strips of 20 from the 11¢ to 50¢ inclusive, and blocks of four from the \$1.00 to the \$5.00 inclusive. When available, blocks of four with plate numbers may be obtained on denominations less than \$1.00 in a limited number if the patron is willing to sacrifice condition, to some extent, for the plate number. The Agency cannot attempt to fill position orders when less than full sheets are requested.

ELECTRIC EYE PLATES

The 2¢ Adams and 3¢ Jefferson stamps, with dashes along the inner vertical margins, as well as 2¢ Adams and 3¢ Jefferson issues which also show short horizontal lines along the outer vertical margin of the left panes, perforated 11x10½ are available printed from special plates designed for use in connection with the perforating machine equipped with the photo-electric cell.
